Dear Pastor and Church,

Receive warm greetings from your servant, our family, and Nueva Vida Baptist Christian Church. We thank God for His grace and faithfulness during these past months of ministry in Pesquería, Nuevo León, Mexico.

From the month of February through the first days of June, God has allowed us to continue serving, teaching, and strengthening our congregation. We began the year with plans, goals, and activities focused on the spiritual growth of the church. However, we also went through a very difficult trial with the passing of our brother Gersain, his wife, and their two children in a road accident. This loss deeply affected our church, but it also brought us together to support the Azuara Hernández family spiritually, morally, and financially.

In February, we held activities focused on strengthening families, especially in the area of marriage. We also had a ladies' conference titled "Illuminated by His Grace." In addition, we began remodeling the building where we currently meet, a project that we continue to develop in stages.

In March, we celebrated our anniversary as an independent church. We held a conference focused on evangelism, an area we have emphasized greatly this year, encouraging our members to preach the gospel and disciple new believers.

In April, we participated in our annual youth camp together with four other churches. Even though the original location was canceled at the last minute, God provided another place, and we were able to have an average attendance of 120 young people. It was a great blessing to see young people from our church take the challenge of preparing to serve the Lord in ministry. Also in April, my wife Brenda underwent a hysterectomy after three years of struggling with her health condition. By God's grace, the medical studies confirmed that the tumor was benign and not cancer.

In May, I had the opportunity to visit churches in the United States through the missionary agency to which we belong. It was a great blessing to meet pastors and churches that love the work of God. I especially thank Brother Carl Hewlett for his help as our translator and as the director of the mission's Spanish-speaking missionaries. While I was away, the church continued working faithfully. God has given us grace to prepare men who serve as deacons, preachers, and helpers in different areas of the ministry. We also had a special activity on May 10 with an average attendance of 50 ladies.

During this month, we will have the graduation of our Bible Institute students, as well as a special service to recognize those who are completing their studies at different educational levels.
